After so many years as a parish priest in Arkansas, I was asked, frequently, how many different assignments I had had throughout my priesthood, and if given the opportunity, would I like to go back and be assigned there again. I always found these two questions as an opportunity to "go down memory lane," and come up with an answer, even though I knew the opportunity would never come my way.

When I was first ordained a priest in 1977, I was assigned to a parish church in West Memphis, Arkansas, which had an elementary school attached to it, and two mission churches as well. Most of my 44 years as a priest involved being assigned as a parish priest, and most of these assignments had an elementary school too. They



were all very good assignments, so it was hard to answer the two questions. But then I always find myself reminiscing about my three years teaching high school at Mount Saint Mary Academy in Little Rock. Among the many blessings of teaching there, was that I was able to form life-long relationships, and even though most of my students are now in their 50s, they carry with them the memories of three of the best years of my life.

So when the Pope assigned me to be the Bishop of Shreveport, I immediately looked to the diocese to see where "my" new high school(s) would be. I have had the privilege of being involved with Loyola since I arrived here, and I feel so much at home when I am doing something that includes you: the students and the teachers. Each visit to the campus, or when we are together in the Cathedral Church, takes me back to my years at Mt. St. Mary. I have often said when asked those two questions, that I loved my assignment at MSM, and would go back there in a heartbeat. And while it still holds wonderful memories – I now find such great joy in begin associated with Loyola. With time, I hope to love you as much as I was loved in Little Rock, and that I can be the kind of Bishop and pastor to you that brings you closer to our Lord as you journey through your Loyola experience.

Know that I pray for you each week and look forward to any opportunity to visit you or just be among you. Call me if you ever need me! May the Lord make the most of our relationship, and may He bless us and all of Loyola.



So, what is the state of the school? Just ask my classmates. It is good. Very good."





Kiley Pulliam constantly searches for ways to create a vibrant learning environment - whether that be designing a new STEM-based class, finding ways to make students feel special, or applying for grants to make these innovations possible.

With a focus on teaching physics, Pulliam - who notes this is her √30.25 th year at Lovola - also teaches robotics, introduction to drone piloting, and principles of 3D printing.



"I actually taught physics here at Loyola in Spring 2004 before going

to graduate school," said Pulliam. "It was an enjoyable experience, so when I moved back, I looked into open positions and found that Algebra II was open at that time. I enjoy that part of my job is to continually learn and improve myself for the benefit of students. I have learned so many things I never thought I'd encounter. It's a win-win."

Her passion for her students is evident. From throwing seasonal parties to "knighting" students for their accomplishments, Pulliam wants to make sure those in her class enjoy being at school.

"I am passionate about the students. They will be handed a very uncertain world but until then I want them to enjoy being kids," she said. "I give out way too much candy, and I sometimes show up in costume. Learning happens during all these things, but it is important to me that students feel a little lighter after my class."

Her teaching style was formed by her time working for the Princeton Review - a philosophy that teaching is better when done as a performance.

"This even included a policy of using multiple color markers in your board work, all to capture your attention and make you want to learn," she said. "I have since taken the performance part more literally. While not every class is a grand performance, the year is punctuated with them: Math Madness, Mardi Gras, Space Day, Black History Month, Amongst Y'all."

She also makes it a point to introduce her students to a variety of technology modalities, something she noted is "no longer simply a tool to demonstrate science principles in the classroom, but an essential endeavor to train students for the technology-heavy career demands of the future."

That is one of the reasons she decided to apply for

a grant from the Ark-La-Tex chapter of the Armed Forces Communications & Electronics Association (AFCEA). This past Spring, she was one of two Loyola faculty members to receive the grant funding. Pulliam used the grant to start a 3D printing program for teaching purposes and to provide the school and community with printed items.

She has exciting plans for both her 3D printing class students—printing a drone and hosting a fashion show—and those not taking the course.



"I'd like to see if students take an interest in the machine as it is in my classroom and see if they have any interesting ideas to try," said Pulliam. "Of course I have ideas, but this is a unique opportunity to watch students interact with something most have never even seen in person and see how creative they can be with their ideas!"

Pulliam's enthusiasm for teaching is almost contagious, but for her, it is seeing that same excitement come to life in her students that inspires her each day. "That enthusiasm from students interested in really finding out why something is the way it is, is one of the most fulfilling aspects of teaching science."

The Road (Trip) to College

This summer Declan Chmielewski and his family used planes, trains and automobiles to travel the country. What was their goal? Touring Declan's dream colleges before his senior year at Loyola College Prep.

A straight A student, SGA Executive Treasurer, and National Honor Society member, Declan is driven and dedicated to his studies, school, and community.

"Declan is truly a remarkable student who studies hard, gives back to his school and community," said Glad Alexander, Director of College Placement. "When I heard about his plans to tour some of the top colleges in the country, I was so thrilled for him. He had the opportunity to really experience these colleges, and I knew he would take plenty of notes and come back with some great stories!"

At the end of his junior year at Loyola, Declan and his family mapped out their college tour to include a stop at sister Maeve's North American Irish Dancing Championship in Phoenix, Arizona.

The Chmielewski family traveled all over the country from the Midwest to the west coast to New England and down through DC and Charlotte and toured a total of 15 colleges.

"When we were visiting Caltech, I was about to get a tour from an alumni, and another alumni awarded us the fortune of dining at the Alumni Club," said Declan. "It was an incredible experience to be able to do that, and one that I know not many high school seniors have a chance to do."

When the Chmielewski family landed in Boston, Massachusetts, they were tired and decided to sightsee the following day: Sunday. Dedicated Catholics, the Chmielewski's started the day going to mass. They went to mass at St. Paul's outside of Harvard Square when they happened upon a special Harvard graduate who started up a conversation with Declan.

"He introduced himself as Father George, and I told him we were touring colleges in Boston, and were about to walk around Harvard." said Declan. "He, an alumni from Harvard who received his postgraduate degree in biochemical engineering, offered to give us a tour of the campus. For two hours we walked, cracked jokes, and later shared lunch with him in Cambridge."

On the two-week trip, Declan was able to not only tour his dream colleges and receive a private tour of Harvard from a priest, but he was able to see firsthand what his future would look like at each stop.

"The trip was so beneficial to my college application process," he said. "There is so much more to a college than its prestige and admissions statistics found on Google. Being there helped place myself in the 'environment', and I was able to tell if it was a good fit for me. I was able to revise a large list of colleges I knew little about and understand what type of community would help me excel during my college years all while strolling through different campuses. I really appreciate the sacrifice and stress my parents endured to make the trip possible."

What is Declan's final choice? He hasn't decided quite yet, but we can't wait to find out!

90 Years of Dedication

During the 2020-21 school year, Camille Meehan, Tony Rinuado and Cathy Kyle did something they haven't done in a long, long time.

Not teach.

The three veteran Loyola educators - with a combined 90 years of experience - each left the classroom behind for a new endeavor retirement.

Meehan began at Loyola in the 1991-92 school year as a language teacher and also served as SGA advisor for 28 years. In addition to teaching French (and Spanish for a few years), she was Foreign Language department head.

It's hard to put into words what these three have meant to our school," said Loyola Principal John LeBlanc. "Their dedication for all these years is an example of what makes our school great. It took me awhile once the school year started to realize they weren't here.

Just don't ask Meehan for a short list of her favorite memories of being at Loyola. "All of the SGA dances and events ... bus trips out of town ... Orientation Day and the excitement of a new school year ... state championship games ... sharing my favorite books with students ... LASC conventions with the SGA members," she said. "There's way too many to list."

In the last few years, Loyola's association with Garden Park Nursing & Rehabilitation Center has been particularly special as Meehan helped direct the school's partnership in connecting the students to the residents of the facility and seeing the joy that it brought to both.

But perhaps the most special was the seeing her four children come through Loyola and having the opportunity to teach three of them.

Rinaudo was a member of the faculty since 1971 and served in a variety of roles, including biology teacher,

assistant football coach, head football coach, assistant baseball coach, assistant principal, golf coach and athletic director.

But his association with Jordan Street goes back further than that. Rinaudo began as a student at St. John's Grade School in the mid 1950s before moving next door to Jesuit High School and graduated in 1967. "I'm not sure how long it's been that I've been going to Jordan Street," he said, "but I know it's been a long time."

Having seen a multitude of changes over the years, Rinaudo points to one in particular as being the most significant. "The year we became a co-ed school (in 1987) was the key," he said. "Without that, who knows what would have happened."

"Not only has Coach Rinaudo been a huge part of this school, but he has been such a big influence on me," current assistant principal and head football coach Mike Greene said. "When I got into coaching, he's the one who took me under his wing and helped me learn what I needed to know. And when I came back as assistant principal a few years ago, he was there to help me learn once again."

Among his favorite memories are the 1976 state football championship and two golf state championships that he coached, but the top memory is less specific. "All the students in those 37 years," he said.

Kyle came to Loyola in the 1996-97 school year when her son was a freshman and, like so many faculty members, took on a variety of roles --

social studies and math teacher, Senior Class sponsor, Social Studies chairman, Senior Trip sponsor and coordinator, cheerleading sponsor, pep squad sponsor ... and more.

"What makes teaching at Loyola special is being able get involved with the students, being able to talk about religion and praying each day with students, and being able to run your own classroom with little



interference," she says. "It was great to be supported when you wanted to do special projects and take field trips. Loyola also has the BEST students."

Her greatest memories include going on European trips and traveling with students, going to cheer camp and driving the "White Van," getting to know the students and having so many great teacher/student relationships with them.

Loyola has a special relationship that students can have with the teachers," Kyle says. "Plus, the willingness of the parents to help in any way to make their experience a success.

"It's a family atmosphere," Meehan says of Loyola. "There's great tradition and history to go with it. The students are respectful and eager and the parents are involved and caring."

"Plus the discipline," Rinuado says. "That's something other schools don't have."

With decades of experience, these three have seen their share of changes over the years. The implementation of technology, renovations, the construction of a new cafeteria (St. Vincent's Hall) and the Athletic Complex, the complete makeover of the gym, a new library ... the list goes on and on. "I even remember when the pay phone was taken out of the compound!" Meehan says.

All three have plans for retirement. "I'm planning to spend more time with my wife and doing whatever we want to do whenever we want to do it," Rinaudo said. "And plenty of golf!"

"Reading, traveling and volunteering," Meehan said. "I've got four grandchildren, so I'll spend time with them and start organizing many years of pictures and memories."

"Spend time with my four grandchildren, garden, read, quilt and travel when it is finally safe to do so," Kyle said. "I may also do some subbing at LCP!"

But Loyola will never be far away from them.

"I am so grateful for the opportunity that Loyola gave me to be a part of the lives of so many outstanding young people who are now adults and no doubt have become leaders in their communities across the country," Meehan said. "My hope is that my students know that they are still remembered with love and that I wish the best for them as they continue to make their way in the world."

Meekins Completes Career at Loyola

Hal Meekins, who spent the last 10 years of his long teaching career at Loyola, also retired during the 2020-21 school year.

Meekins came to Loyola in 2012 and taught a variety of courses including Physics AP (C), Honors Physics, College Prep Physics, Environmental Science, Robotics, and Calculus BC.

"The opportunity for teachers to express their faith is what makes Loyola special," Meekins said. "Having Mass every week is also very special."

Greene, Schonfarber Lead Loyola Sports

Big changes for Flyer Athletics happened over the summer with the announcement of Mike Greene as the interim head football coach and Ben Schonfarber as the Athletic Director.

Current Assistant Principal of Discipline Mike Greene, who ranks No. 7 in coaching wins among Caddo-Bossier schools, is back on the sidelines as the interim coach for the Flyers this year. Coach Greene will continue to fulfill his role of Assistant Principal of Discipline.

Greene was the head coach at Loyola, Airline, Fair Park and Booker T. Washington from 1992 to 2017 before becoming assistant principal at Loyola for the last three years.

"All along in the back of mind I've been thinking about how much I miss coaching," Greene said. "So when I got the call, I didn't even have to think about it. I knew this was something I wanted to do. I couldn't be more excited."

Greene played for the Flyers from 1980-82 and became an assistant coach in 1987. He took over as head coach in 1993 and was 30-27, highlighted by an appearance in the Superdome in 1994 for the Class 2A state championship game.

"More than anything else, I want these kids to know the importance of what Flyer football is all about," Greene said. "It's not always about who has the best athletes or the most players. Flyer football has always been about wanting to win and doing it the right way like it's been done for a long time. It's important to me to keep that going."

Ben Schonfarber is currently the head boys basketball coach and serves as the physical education teacher. He was named the Athletic Director earlier this school year and will take on that responsibility in addition to his other roles at Loyola College Prep.

"We are excited to have Ben support our coaches and players with everything they need to succeed this year in their sports," Principal John H. LeBlanc said. "This includes day-to-day logistics for athletics, LHSAA paperwork, ensuring coaches are up to date on their training and budgets, and helping our students grow and achieve their goals."

Ben is a 2009 LCP graduate and has worked at Loyola for a total of nine years. He left Loyola for a year to get his master's degree in sport management at Florida State and worked as a graduate assistant with the men's basketball program.

DR. JOHN EVANS

On the night of November 10, 2000, on a football field in Reserve, La., John Evans' future changed. But at that moment, it wasn't his future he was worried about. Of more immediate concern was his broken right leg.

In a game that was already lost on a play that had no chance of success, Evans, the Loyola quarterback, was tackled as he scrambled toward the Flyers' sideline.

He didn't get up.

If you had asked 16-year-old John Evans what his chosen occupation was going to be when he graduated from college, not only would "heart surgeon" not have been at the top of the list, it wouldn't have even made the list at all.

But in the course of enduring the rehabilitation of his broken leg, things began to change. Today, he is John M. Evans, MD, a cardiovascular & thoracic surgeon at CHRISTUS Shreveport-Bossier.

"I probably thought I would go into the oil and gas business," Evans said. "But I was fascinated with the process of what was going on with getting my leg fixed. I knew then that I wanted to be a part of helping

people in that healing process."

Evans came back quite well from his broken leg during the playoff game in his sophomore year and went on to be a three-year starter at quarterback. Two decades later, he is still No. 7 on the Flyers' career passing yards list. But when he came back to Loyola to speak at Career Day in March, 2020, it wasn't to discuss touchdown passes.

"It was surreal and nostalgic." Evans said. "I realized that I had not stepped foot in those halls since graduation, and that is too long. The students were very respectful and engaging. I would have loved to have had a Career Day when I was in high school, and I think it is outstanding that Loyola is providing this opportunity for its students now. I was fortunate Loyola gave me the chance to participate, as the whole experience was rewarding and quite an honor."

After earning a degree in biology from LSU, Evans graduated from LSU's medical school in Shreveport in 2011. He then completed a residency in general surgery at UA-Birmingham over the next five years and says he "fell in love with heart surgery." He completed a residency in cardiothoracic surgery at Vanderbilt before moving back to Shreveport in 2019.

"I greatly enjoy being a physiciansurgeon and consider it a great honor and privilege to take care of patients," Evans said. "I get satisfaction working with my hands and achieving a technical objective, and that certainly gets fulfilled each day in the operating room. It is rewarding to help people; contributing in the effort to improve

a patient's quality of life, oftentimes prolonging their life, and even sometimes saving their life."

It's a road that started at 921 Jordan Street.

"Loyola served as a launch pad, sending me on my way to achieve my career dreams and aspirations," Evans said. "As a student at Loyola, I did not appreciate the premium education I was receiving, but in retrospect, I certainly do now and am forever indebted to the school. I have thanked

> my parents for sending me to such a fine school, for making that commitment and investment in me."

That commitment and investment is just as important today as it was when Evans was a student. "The challenging curriculum clearly sets one up for success at the next level both academically and professionally," he said. "The wide array of extracurricular

opportunities from sports, to academic clubs, to community involvement and enhancement opportunities facilitate development of a balanced student.

"Most importantly, however, is the school's cultivation and nurturing of its students' faith," he added. "The aforementioned pursuits are futile if not set on a firm foundation of Catholic Christian principled values promoted by a school such as Loyola, and this is certainly reassuring and refreshing in a progressively more secular society."

Married with four children, Evans recognizes what Loyola did for him and can do for current and future students. "I greatly encourage the current and prospective students to take advantage of what this great school has to offer," he said. "This school can serve as a launch pad that can shoot you up to the moon and beyond. Develop good study habits now that will serve you well in college and beyond. Compete against no one except yourself. Demand nothing but a full effort and you will not be disappointed."




FROM THE ADVANCEMENT DIRECTOR






