FROM THE BISHOP

As a child I used to collect baseball cards. I am not sure if that custom is still carried on much by lovers of baseball. In fact, most of the cards I collected have disappeared, with one or two exceptions. There was an "art form" to collecting such cards, which we bought at the local candy store. Each packet of cards contained some bubble gum strips, and four or five new cards featuring a contemporary star, whose face was on one side, and his "stats" on the reverse. My friends and I would meet periodically and bring with us a whole stack of cards, sometimes 50-100 cards in all. We would go through them with one another, and trade cards we needed. This process of "trading" was accompanied by a "show" of which card we were willing to trade, and waiting for a response from our friends: "got'em" or "need'em." And so the exchange would begin. The more astute among us would know the value of one card over another, and the acquisition of a card we needed to complete our growing collection. The bottom line was the joy we would have going back home, and once inside, going through our newly acquired valuable cards. These were among the treasures of our youth.



When I arrived in Shreveport as Bishop two and a half years ago, I looked around at what became clearly familiar territory: churches, schools and hospitals. Every Diocese has these, and the ones I began to take note of as I began my "getting to know you" time of my episcopacy were prominent. Some of them were "got'ems," the ones I was familiar with when I was a priest in Arkansas. Some, I felt like I "needed 'em," to make me feel at home among you. All of them made me feel welcomed here, and, as it were, "made me feel at home."

One of them is Loyola College Prep, a Catholic high school in the Diocese of Shreveport. Here, now, I am writing out of ignorance, not knowing if new students to Loyola actually know the source of its name. I have asked myself the question frequently, does everyone know that our name, "Loyola," is what sets our school apart as a Catholic school, with deep roots in the Jesuit community, and thus a Catholic school through and through?

I have wondered how many of our patrons, our parents, faculty, and especially our students would know that branding of "Loyola," is rooted in the 16th century, named after St. Ignatius of Loyola... that Loyola was called Jesuit High School prior to its present branding of Loyola College Prep?

As I write this article, I want you to know that since I have been here in Shreveport, a number of people have asked me "Is Loyola a Catholic school?" I was shocked that such a question would be asked, and perhaps their question has deeper roots. But, I want everyone to know that Loyola IS Catholic through and through, and as the Bishop of the Diocese, I see this reinforced by the administration, by the presence of priests in the corridors, of the frequency of confession and school Masses, of the curriculum that is clearly Catholic, in the annual "Ring Ceremony Mass," when Senior rings are blessed for the approaching seniors, and the Baccalaureate Mass, celebrating the Seniors about to graduate, and in the privilege I have of handing diplomas to them as they take their leave of Loyola, even if the name "Catholic" is not in the branding.

In other words, if it's merely a question of "got'em" or "need'em," we have them at Loyola. Can we be "more" Catholic? Sure, but let's celebrate what we have, and rejoice in the Catholicity that is a part and the foundation of this great school.


Excellence is the ability to earn college credit while still enrolled at Loyola, with a 68 to 72% pass rate on AP testing in the 13 AP classes we offer.

Blank Slate Tutoring Takes Top Prize

Loyola College Prep freshman Carigan Carr was the big winner in the fourth annual Flyers & Buyers contest. Four Flyer student finalist teams presented their business pitches to local business "Buyers" in March. The event, sponsored by Louisiana Tech College of Business, Home Federal Bank, CHRISTUS Shreveport-Bossier Health System, River Cities Interventional Pain Specialists, and Barksdale Federal Credit Union is conducted through the Loyola Law Studies Program and teaches students how to start a business, make a marketing plan,

and answer tough questions from potential investors.

The Buyers named Carr the winner for her fresh take on peer to peer tutoring that incorporates an art component. Her business, Blank Canvas Tutoring, focuses on peer-to-peer, personalized tutoring where students summarize what they learned at the end of their 9 week session with a painting.

Carr won \$500 cash as well as a \$1,000 scholarship to Louisiana Tech University's College of Business. The second and third place teams also won a \$500 scholarship to the college as well.

He said he was impressed with all of the Flyers and especially proud of Carr.



"However, the greatest impact is more existential, as I've been blown away by how the program helps students overcome the fear of putting themselves out there."

Loyola Chaplain Father Raney Johnson said seminarians need to have developed a prayer life before entering the seminary. Catholic schools help build this spiritual foundation for students.

"Loyola helps to form young men in the spiritual life by giving them an environment in which they can pray and learn about their faith," he said. "Seminarians are also rooted in the sacraments, especially the sacraments of Eucharist and Penance. Loyola prepares students discerning the priesthood by giving them the opportunity to attend Mass each week and allowing them to have frequent access to Confession. In a sense, Loyola is not only a preparatory school for college but also a preparatory school for seminary."



Glad Alexander Retires After 41 Years at Loyola College Prep

The 2021-22 school year was her last at Loyola College Prep, but those who thought she would leave as soon as final exams ended must not know Glad Alexander very well.

There's still work to be done.

As summer began, she continued to do what she has done for 41 years. She met with students and parents about college plans, even though she would be in retirement when these same students actually enrolled in college. She also worked with her successor so the transition would be as smooth as possible.

Yes, she slowly moved some things out of her office, but even after the school took a break for the summer, she came back to finish doing what she has always done best.

Make a difference.

When Alexander first came to Loyola, the school wasn't even called Loyola. When she was hired for the 1981-82 school year, it was the final one for it to be known as

Jesuit. She has been coming to 921 Jordan Street ever since as a speech teacher, debate coach, admissions director, college placement director, van driver, party coordinator and whatever else might be needed to be done. But no matter what her role has been, she has had one thing in mind.

"Who could I help today?" she says. "What difference might I make? Not just for today, but for later. And it's something that I might never know."

Over the course of 41 years, plenty has changed. But what she has seen as her role has not.

"I cared to make things right," Alexander says. "I cared to make things good. I wanted the kids to do things to the best of their ability and not sell themselves short. And I hope that's what people remember me for."

Alexander has impacted thousands of students and co-workers, but she says there is no doubt what Loyola has done for her as well.

"The school has impacted my life in more ways than I can count," she says. "I have always believed in the mission of the school. I believe that what it is doing, at its core, is the best thing we can do for young people. We are helping them grow not just educationally, but spiritually, morally

and physically in every way."

She has been at the school for one-third of its existence, so she has seen how it continues to thrive with each passing year.

"That's what is great about Loyola - no matter what changes, no matter who comes and goes, it carries on with a new life," Alexander says. "You contribute when you can and when you can't, somebody else will come in and fill the role and keep right on going."

As for how she will handle retirement, she knows a definite transition awaits.

"It is bittersweet," she says. "I don't know what it's going to feel like when the new school year comes and the kids are in school and ... I'm not there. That's going to be weird. I'll come back to Style Shows and football games. But it will just be different."

For someone who has done so much for so many, Glad Alexander's legacy at Loyola College Prep can be summed up quite simply.

"I'd like to be remembered," she says, "as someone who cared."


Anna Beth Clark to replace Mrs. Alexander

At that time, he left his mark as a Flyer by contributing to the Jesuit 1967 state championship football team, playing in the band for two years, participating in student government, and making friendships that would last a lifetime.

Earlier this year, Gary left a lasting legacy on Loyola College Prep by leaving \$1.5 million after he died in October 2020.

"The students of Loyola College Prep and all of the Flyer family are blessed by the generosity of Mr. Christ who never forgot his alma mater even as he served our country, excelled in his career as a pilot, and lived outside of our city," said John LeBlanc, Loyola College Prep Principal. "We are thankful for this extraordinary gift, and I don't think we can fully express how this will impact our school for generations to come. Mr. Christ showed the importance of generosity and giving back that we try to instill in all of our students."

After graduating from Jesuit, Christ received his bachelor's degree in Microbiology from Louisiana Tech University and received an MBA in business and political science from Arizona State University. Christ proudly served his country in the United States Air Force as a fighter pilot. Upon leaving the Air Force with the rank of Captain, he became a pilot for Southwest Airlines in 1987 and retired in 2015. Gary was an avid outdoorsman, climbing many of the world's largest peaks. He passed away in October 2020.

Flyers win girls state soccer championship!



The already-impressive legacy of Flyer girls soccer added another milestone in the 2021-22 season as Loyola became the first Shreveport-Bossier team (boys or girls) to win multiple state soccer championships.

But the team had to overcome recent history to do it.

Strawberry Stadium in Hammond had left a bitter taste for the Flyers in the last two years. In fact, Loyola hadn't scored a goal in 190 minutes of regulation or overtime on the field at Southeastern Louisiana. Two years ago it was a 1-0 loss to University Lab and in 2021, it was a penalty-kick loss, again to University.

So when the Flyers fell behind 1-0 to Archbishop Hannan in this year's title game, you couldn't help but wonder.

"It's always in the back of your mind of whether we are going to have another one like before," Loyola coach Mark Matlock said. "And when you go down 1-0, that's the first thing that creeps into your mind."

But the second half took care of that as the Flyers scored four goals in rapid-fire succession to come away a 4-1 win and lift another trophy in the post-game celebration.

The blended stories of the four Loyola goal scorers is interesting – Erin Campbell and Kennedy Jarrett were

significant contributors as freshman on the last state title team while sophomore Mary Helen Burford and junior Madalyn VanDevender were managers on last year's state final team due to being ineligible as transfer students.

"I think we were all just excited and nervous in the first half," Jarrett said. "We finally got our heads in the game. I think we all needed to realize that we needed to trust each other that we weren't going to make mistakes."

"Coach just told us to keep the pressure on in the second half," VanDevender said. "We've worked our butts off all season and we knew we were the better team"

"Our pressure in the second half made the difference," said Burford, who was named as the game's MVP. "We just wanted it more and we were going to go get it."

There have been years in which the

Loyola girls soccer team didn't have enough experience to win a state championship match. Years in which the Flyers simply weren't the better team. Or the opponent just had one player who was a difference maker.

There have been years in which a controversial goal made the difference. Another that resulted in the ultimate agony – a loss on penalty kicks. And there was that year in which the Flyers did come away with the championship, though even that came with a small asterisk.

The lesson here is that no matter how many times you get to a state championship match, some kind of unique challenge awaits.

The previous title in 2019 came in Division IV, which the Flyers dropped down to that year after playing in title games in both Divisions II and III. A title is a title, but this one answered the question of whether Loyola could win in a higher classification.

"This is what I might consider my most complete team," Matlock said. "But I'm so proud of the girls for keeping their composure and getting back into it in the second half."

Loyola played an incredibly tough schedule, going against both of the Division I finalists, a Division II state finalist, and five other quarterfinalists in either Division I or II.



Coach Tanner Steps Off The Court...Again

It's hard to say which one Loyola girls basketball coach Kyle Tanner has done more – retire from coaching or rebuild the program. He's certainly done plenty of both during his years with the Lady Flyers.

This time around, the retirement certainly seems to be official as he steps away from the program and Jaila Dooley takes over for the 2022-23 season. Don't worry, Tanner will remain on the faculty and has no plans to retire from teaching anytime soon.

Tanner will retire as the winningest coach in the program's history, highlighted by the Class 2A state championship in 2011-12 season.

"I know I'll miss it," Tanner said. "I think I'll really miss the competition aspect of it. I'm a different kind of person when I get on the sideline. I'll miss the relationship with the players because you get really close to them.

"Just the challenge of it all," he added. "That will be the biggest thing I'll miss."

Tanner will retire as the winningest coach in the program's history, highlighted by the Class 2A state championship in 2011-12 season.

He certainly had his share of challenges. After six years as an assistant coach, Tanner took over for Rob Horneman in the 2007-08 season.

"When I started, that was a rebuild," Tanner said. "No seniors and only two juniors. That was mainly a freshman team. I was really just happy to avoid a losing season."

But after that 17-17 season, Tanner won 110 games in the next four years. The senior-dominated state championship team went 34-3 and really wasn't even challenged on the way to the title.

"I remember the amount of pressure on that state championship because it was expected," he said. "We thought we'd be there the year before (reaching the semifinals), but we had to deal with some injuries that year. I felt we had the best team (in 2011-12). It was more of a relief that we got it done."



Enter Rebuild #2 as the Flyers lost four of the top scorers in school history from that team. But Tanner led them to a fourth straight district championship.

"After we won the state championship, people thought we would fall off the cliff," he said. "But we came back and made it to the quarterfinals that next year."

Two years later, Tanner decided to step away and work as an assistant with Steve McDowell, who he had worked with at Southwood in the 1990s. But when McDowell left after three years, Tanner was back in charge in 2018-19 as the Lady Flyers won the district title with a 21-11 record.

Then came Rebuild #3 as well as another Un-Retirement.

Tanner had planned to stop coaching (again) after that year, but a month before the season, the new coach left the program.

Back to the sidelines went Tanner, but was faced with a team that had graduated their five leading scorers and returned only freshmen with little experience. That 2019-20 team won only four games, but won 12 games the next year and 15 this season.

"Even the last time we rebuilt it, that was still a lot of fun," he said.

Tanner will leave the Loyola sidelines with 241 wins and five district titles.

Jaila Dooley will take the reins as head coach for the 2022-23 season. She joined Loyola as a physical education teacher and assistant



basketball coach in 2020, and will be the first female basketball coach in the school's history.

"It's a great feeling to be the first female basketball coach at Loyola," she said. "We need more women to take on leadership roles to show young girls that they can do it too. There is a long history of great coaches here at Loyola, especially in basketball, and I am grateful to be among them."

Prior to joining Loyola, Dooley was a student basketball coach at East Texas Baptist University and has coached basketball for Thrive 360, a nonprofit organization that helps at-risk teens. She also played college basketball at LeTourneau University.




The Girls Soccer Team won the Division III State Championship with a 4-1 victory over Archbishop Hannan.



After playing five years in the NFL, Jon Alston '01 was well acquainted with what it was like to be in a competitive line of work. So once his football career ended, he set his sights on a more creative field.

A former All-State linebacker at Loyola in 2000, Alston now lives in Los Angeles and is an acclaimed writer, director, and producer. His award-winning films include *Augustus* and *Red Butterfly*.

"I've been fortunate to be able to shift gears to another career that is also very competitive," he says. "But my back story in sports really helps me stand out. Not a lot of people can transition from one lucrative, high-level occupation to the next."

It didn't just happen overnight.

He has certainly broken through. He has been a story editor for TV series such as *S.W.A.T.* and *All-American* (where he was able to put his football background to use) as well as others in production.

Alston focuses on social justice in many of his works as a producer and director. "I was in St. Louis after Michael Brown was killed (2014). My apartment was 10 minutes from Canfield Drive," he says. "Needless to say the subsequent unrest and Grand Jury verdict were incredibly divisive. And not just nationally or on the news, but between my friends as well. Interestingly enough, Shreveport is one of the only places I've ever been where people have disagreed politically but can still find ways to relate as human beings."

It was in St. Louis (now the Los Angeles Rams) where Alston first came into the NFL. He was drafted out of Stanford by the Rams in the third round of the 2006 draft.

"It was hurtful to see people I cared for so divided without truly knowing why," Alston says. "So I dug in. Spent months researching and reading all publicly available information about the case and the context surrounding it in St. Louis.... which is and has historically been terrible/borderline inhumane. Eventually, what I found and what I concluded through that three-month journey really opened my eyes."

But it took time. A lot of time.

"I started writing what eventually became a very honest, evocative and ultimately unifying screenplay that explored the various attitudes of locals in the aftermath of Brown's death that I didn't completely finish until 2021, but versions had won competitions and helped me start my career in Hollywood," he says.

Alston has won plenty of awards for his works – he says he's on the verge of creating his own television shows – but what success he has had is only a by-product of what he wants to accomplish.

"The takeaway," he says, "is that all of my works seek to unify."


St. Vincent's Alumnae Association Update



The biggest blessing and surprise of the year was a \$1.5 million donation from the Christ family. Specifically, a former Flyer, Gary Christ, Jesuit class of 1968, chose Loyola College Prep as one of three charities to receive a portion of his estate. His generous contribution is a testament to the impact our school makes on students. The endowment is earmarked specifically for community scholarships, making attendance to Loyola College Prep available to more families. I hope this gift serves as both a beacon and challenge for continued support of Lovola.


The statue stands at an impressive 7.5 feet tall, and comes from Belgium. It's wood-based with the most beautifully carved details.


